<b>Course Objectives:</b>	To make the youth Step 1 Sensitive to the problems of the community Step 2 Develop Seva-Bhav values Step 3 Develop their leadership skills Step 4 Enhance oral and written communication skills and Learn to work as a team member	
<b>Course Duration:</b>	A minimum of 15 hours of initial training to empower the students for community service activities and 15 hours for planning the activities followed by actual field work of 60 hours. Students have to register at the beginning of the academic year during the odd semesters and will be assessed at the end of the academic year in the even semesters.	
<b>Content:</b>	(A) Empowering the students for Community Service Activities MCT 501 Mind Management Course / Any equivalent course	15 hours
	(B) Project/Internship Planning (15 hours) Project Planning, Proposal Submission including the motivation for the work proposed, expected outcomes/impact, time-line, etc., Selection of a Village, Presentation and approval of the Proposal by the Mentor	15 hours
	(C) Project Implementation in any Village (60 hours)	60 hours
<b>Pedagogy:</b>	Step 1 Appointment of Co-ordinator by the Principal/Dean of the School for each discipline under the School Step 2 Students / Interns to identify the location/community for Internship and register as a Team with a minimum of 3 and a maximum of 10 members. Step 3 Assigning of maximum 2 Teams to a mentor by respective Internship Co-ordinators. Step 4 Registration on sbsi portal by Internship Co-ordinators and Mentors. Step 5 Registration on sbsi portal by Interns Step 6 Each Team to submit the internship proposal to the Mentor for approval and upload approved proposal on sbsi portal. Step 7 After obtaining approval, carry out the activities and submit monthly reports to SBSI Mentor for each activity carried out and upload it on the sbsi portal for documentation. Step 8 After completion of 60 hours, submit the final report to the Mentor as per the prescribed format and also upload on sbsi portal. Step 9 The Assessment committee shall comprise of the Mentor, the Internship Co-

<b>Assessment Details:</b>	<p>ISA component assessment by Mentor based on the interactions and the monthly report submissions. (20 marks)</p> <p>SEA component assessment by Assessment Committee based on the final report submission (20 marks), presentation (20 marks) and evidences in video/audio/social media/etc., of impact made (40 marks).</p>
